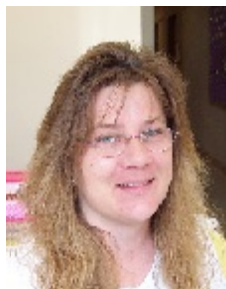


# A GREAT UNIVERSITY DEPENDS ON GREAT WORKERS
